While the teacher was great, I continuously did poor on exams, it's not as if I didn't know the material but the exam environment with such small areas for points, Atleast to me, felt obnoxious how l'd lose so much just from a few mistakes.

The two main suggestions I have would be 1) Try to spend more time in class explaining the core material through more than pictures and the language of math as I think that will catch a few more students. Examples are good but it heavily favors students who learn by

3 doing.
2)Make the practice assignments due before the homework if possible, so students get more chances to master the material.

Some times you move a little too quickly in class, and when you do the examples, there are times where you do not explain the steps you take when solving a problem, leaving me very confused as to how you did it.
