

Question: What is your overall opinion of this instructor as a teacher? Explain.

Response Rate: 90.63% (29 of 32)

Professor Lorent is very well versed in Calculus and relays the meaning of the subject matter to the class very 1 well. I struggled in the beginning of the semester, but thanks to him, I am back on track and am looking at a potential B in the course.

Professor Lorent is one of my favorite teachers thus far. He does an excellent job of explaining topics in class, always wanting us to understand the material more than just memorization. He takes the time to talk with us in class and make sure we understand the material before moving on to the next part of lecture. He welcomes questions during class and often poses questions to us to see how we are faring. If you are willing to work hard, he will work with you to do well in the course. He inspires me to work hard in the class because he respects us as students and I feel empowered to learn calculus 2 under his leadership.

He is genuinely concerned with the well being and performance of each and every individual student within his classes. He makes mathematics interesting and much easier to understand with clear pictures and representations of seemingly tough topics. He focuses keenly on how to derive a formula rather than just telling someone to memorize it, allowing for reproducing the formulas to be much easier. He also holds additional problem sessions for students who need additional help, and even weekend ones over days prior to a midterm/exam. For all of these reasons, has has allowed me to succeed in calculus II and I would highly recommend him to any student studying on any level of mathematics. It has been a pleasure to be his student.

Lorent is very interested in what he's teaching, however, he can at times be inarticulate. He tries very hard to provide a visual representation but his approach to this is flawed. For example, when demonstrating the x,y,z axis he attempts to make imaginary axis and place a marker at the given point; he could just as easily draw this on the board and provide a visual that way. Aside from this professor Lorent's enthusiasm and willingness to help his students is impeccable. He is a great professor with only a few short comings. I am glad to have him as my Calc professor.

5 Okay. Not great, but willing to help and try to explain.

Professor Lorent is the best professor I've had while attending the University of Cincinnati. He loves what he 6 teaches and teaches it well and is understanding of students when they are confused. If I had to say anything I would say the math department chose the wrong person to be in charge.

He speeds too fast through the material. Often times he rushes to catch up and doesn't give enough examples of the kind of problems we would have to solve. He does a lot to help us visualize the concepts in his lecture but when it comes to doing anything other than a simple example problem, the students are at a loss. He

doesn't give any handouts or quizzes for points, and the online homework is often times more difficult than many of the exam questions. His handwriting is really hard to read because his 'x's and 'k's look like 'r's, his 'm's look like 'n's, and his 'j's look like 'i's. This causes a lot of confusion when there are formulas containing one or more of these variables.

It is very hard to read what is written on the board and that makes it really to also listen to what he is saying because I am trying to understand was is on the board. He also talks very fast and that makes it very difficult
